WORDS FROM THE PASTOR - January 2025

"Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name! Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits," (Psalm 103:1-2)

I remember these sentences from the Psalms which followed almost every formal departure prayer among our Indian churchmen/women - something that I always cherished. If you continue reading the psalm there is a list of those benefits of the Lord: forgiveness, healing, redemption, mercy, peace and the establishment of justice among other things.

As we come to the beginning of a new year and move forward into one that sees people here and around the world so at odds with each other socially, politically, economically and even religiously, it can be difficult to focus on those good things if one only focuses on all the troubles - real and imagined - that seem to be the order of things. Add to that the seemingly more than the usual natural disasters and military conflicts occurring, and many people wonder whether God has done/is doing anything good at all.

If one looks at the list of His blessings again they are the things that go against the 'natural' scheme of things, which favors some at the expense of others, and the strong at the expense of the weak. In our fallen world there will always be problems.

But when we look at Christmas, we see that God was and is also at work in those mitigating factors to counter selfishness, greed, injustice and unconcern for the world we live in. Rather than despair we need to thank God that His Spirit continues to work in some people - and hopefully His people - to move all people to work for the common good. This working happens in people in every field and environment - and is given to us as a challenge to live out in every vocation we find ourselves in.

Sometimes, even trouble brings out good, as Joseph pointed out to his brothers in Genesis 50:19-20, and Jesus said about the blind man he healed in John 9. God can take even the bad and use it for good and His glory. We still count/ depend on that. Christ's death and resurrection, of course, is the best example of this.

As we move into another Anno Domini - Year of our Lord - let us not forget what Psalm 24 tells us:

"The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein, for he has founded it upon the seas and established it upon the rivers."

God gives us this world to live in, but reminds us that it is His and for everyone. **This new year is another chance to work on His agenda.** Of course He also gives us the free will to deny that. Actions on our part have consequences in both ways in life - good ways and bad ways. God will finally also act out of His own sense of justice, too, to stop or punish our acts. But because of Christmas we are reminded just how much more He loves us in spite of our sin and wants and works the best for us in giving us Jesus and then sending His Spirit.

Pray that His Spirit comes to work in each of us for the sake of all once again in this AD 2025.

2023–2025 MISSION GRANT NO. 23 | A LEGACY OF LOVE FOR SPECIAL NEEDS CHILDREN | LUTHERAN SPECIAL EDUCATION MINISTRIES | \$100,000 | All God's Children Need to Learn About Jesus

Lutheran School Education Ministry (LSEM) has been serving children with learning needs for 150 years. Children who have learning disabilities and for whom a Christian education needs to be available are underserved and the most vulnerable among us. One in five children in the United States has a learning need, and these children often face choosing between a



public school that can address their learning needs or a Christian education that will develop their spiritual needs. LSEM works and partners with schools and congregations to meet the learning needs of the children in their classrooms. In many cases, the support LSEM offers allows children to attend Christian schools. The Christian school encourages a personal relationship with Jesus and supports academic growth in math and reading and promotes on-going healthy brain development and function through an enriching fine arts program.

The LSEM ministry vision is to reach out to provide the opportunity for every child to receive specialized learning services. The "Legacy of Love" mission grant enables LSEM to serve a growing number of students with learning needs and allows them to attend Lutheran schools across the country and throughout the world. This means that more children would be able to receive an education to set them up for success while experiencing God's love in an amazing Christian environment.

Throughout LSEM's history God has graciously blessed them. Although the education landscape is constantly changing, LSEM is committed to partner with Christian communities to ensure children receive the individual, specialized learning services they need to be successful and thrive both in and out of the classroom. The grant will provide funds to help LSEM develop and research tools and techniques that will provide resources to Lutheran churches welcoming God's children and their families into their church families now and in future years. *In paths that they have not known I will guide them. I will turn the darkness before them into light, the rough places into level ground. These are the things I do, and I do not forsake them (Isaiah 42:16b).*

2023–2025 MISSION GRANT NO. 28 | GROWING OUR PLACE: CARE FOR SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS | OUR PLACE AFTER SCHOOL CARE, INC. NEBRASKA | \$20,000 Providing Dignity to Special Needs Teenagers

Our Place After School Care is a caring, Christian community for special needs students between the ages of 13 and 20 who are unable to be safe when home alone and have aged out of the Hastings, Nebraska, area's daycares. Grounded in a Christ-like love for their neighbors, Our Place provides programming designed to promote academic, social, and life skills appropriate to each student's needs. It also provides opportunities to grow spiritually through community service and enrichment activities. By providing space and programming for their children, Our Place also supports the dignity and needs of the students' parents. Among the most critical of these needs is gainful employment. Without appropriate care for their children, many parents are unable to maintain regular employment. Any family in the south-central region surrounding Hastings, Nebraska, may enroll a student in Our Place.



Our Place is in its fourth year of operation. It is a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of the LCMS, and Faith Lutheran Church has provided space for its operation. With the increasing number of students, a new facility was needed, and the grant will help with increased rent and utility costs. The larger facility will allow the expansion of programming to include the opening of the Freedom Factory store. Students in the program will identify, make, and sell items in the store. Cost of computer software needed to help manage the store will be met with grant funds. The grant funds also provide scholarship aid to those in need. There are families who have employment challenges that lack the flexibility needed to care for their special needs child and the rest of their family. Our Place scholarships will allow more families to enroll their children in this safe place that offers appropriate programming for their special needs child.

Students gain skills with the Freedom Factory and those skills will serve them as they transition to adulthood. The students and their families benefit from the care offered by Our Place. It is a Christian-centered approach to personal development. The Gospel is shared, and the Christian community grows.

Because you are precious in my eyes, and honored, and I love you (Isaiah 43:4a). See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are (1 John 3:1a).
